



Childress Women's League Receives \$10,000 from South Plains Electric Cooperative and CoBank

LUBBOCK, TX (July 6, 2021) – Childress Women's League will receive a \$10,000 donation from South Plains Electric Cooperative and CoBank to go toward their Backpack Program. This donation comes right before school starts and the program gets busier. The check presentation will be at South Plains Electric Cooperative on July 13 at 3 p.m.

The Childress Women's League Backpack Program was created to further their mission to help women and children. They started the Backpack Program when they saw that the poverty level triggered free breakfasts available for all children at all school campuses. They were determined to address hunger issues and to assure that no child would experience hunger under their watch. Thus, the Backpack Program was born. Weekend food for families would travel home in a backpack on a weekly basis to provide food for the entire family throughout the weekend. A hungry child is not prepared to learn. As the poverty level continues to increase, the numbers of families the League serves is also escalating.

South Plains Electric Cooperative's goal is to provide safe and reliable electricity at the lowest-possible cost. SPEC abides by the Seven Cooperative Principles, and one Principle is commitment to community. The Cooperative gives back to many charities and organizations in the local communities they serve.
