Operation Round Up is funded by Cooperative members rounding their bill up to the nearest dollar.

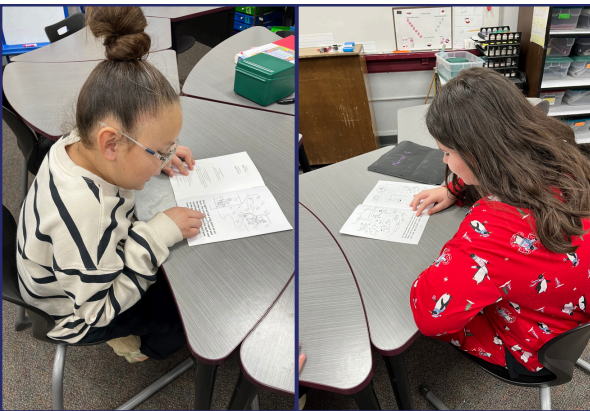

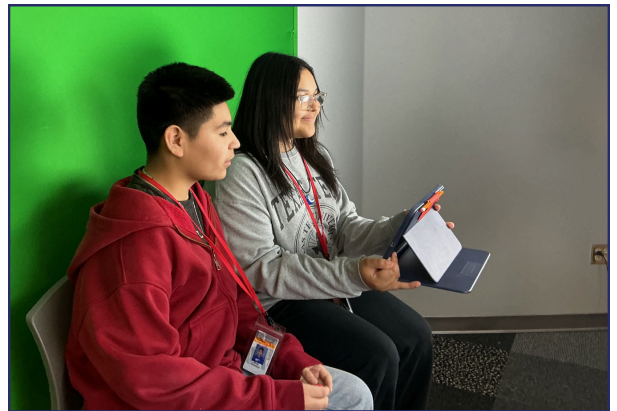
