Operation Round Up is funded by Cooperative members rounding their bill up to the nearest dollar.

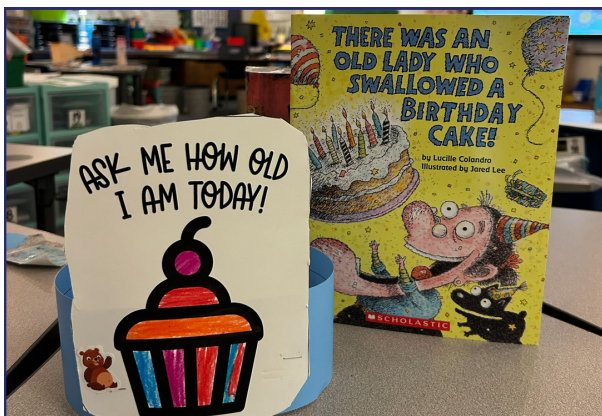

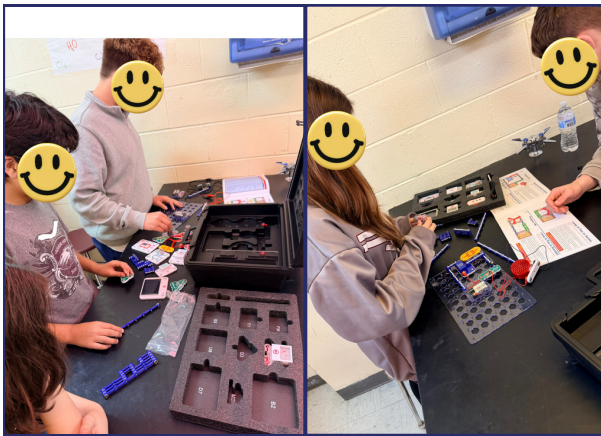
Emily Fleshman, a teacher at Lubbock ISD, used her grant to buy bins and other supplies to organize her classroom to make it more accessible for her and her students.

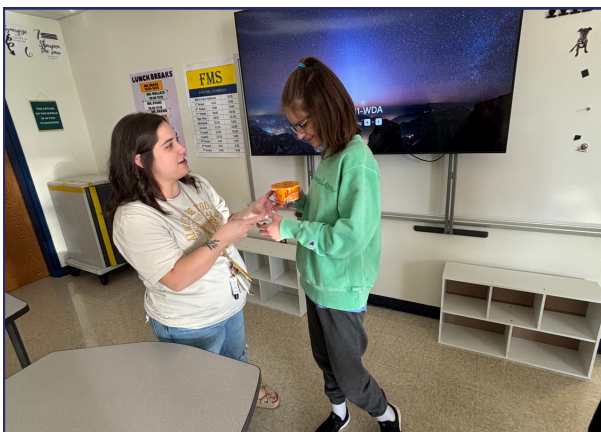
Kasey Montgomery, a teacher at Roosevelt Jr. High, used her grant to take students out to eat after teaching them basic manners and table etiquette.
