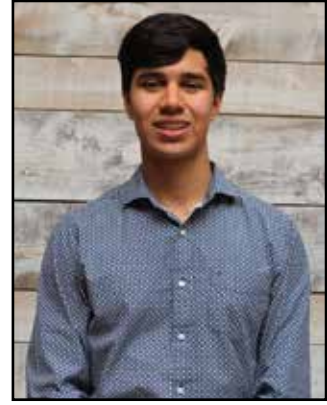
Aubry Heinrich
